Word origin: Atheist originated in two Greek roots: "A" which means "without" or "not" and "Theos" which means "deity."

Definitions:

A person who feels that we have no method by which we can conclude whether a deity exists is an **Agnostic**.

What does the Bible say about atheism?

Romans 1:20: "For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse."

Romans 2:15: "Which shew the work of the law written in their hearts, their conscience also bearing witness, and their thoughts the mean while accusing or else excusing one another." (KJV) That is, even people who do have not been exposed to the Bible have God's standards "written in their hearts" as part of their being. (In Biblical times, the heart and kidneys were believed to be where human thoughts arose and were stored).
